

WordPress Site Initial Checklist

Hosting and Domain Choose reliable host (you often get what you pay for) [It is a good idea to keep your domain registrar and site host separate]. Choose a domain name (easy to remember and accurately reflects your brand identity Set up SSL/ TLS for your domain (consider purchasing certificate if a business) Identify how/ who you contact if your server goes down Identify how you will update your site (plugins, themes, etc.). Do you need a test or QA? Determine frequency of backups (daily/ weekly/ monthly)

WordPress Initial

Identify where you will store site archives

Install WordPress (5 minute setup) [Do not use admin as the administrator username]
Use a passphrase as a password for administrators [www.correcthorsebatterystaple.net is an example of a passphrase generator]
Check your time zone (Settings -> General)
Set your date and time format and starting day of week (Settings -> General)

Confirm your admin email address is correct (Settings -> General)

Restore your backup to confirm that all has been backed up properly

Enable comment moderation (Settings -> Discussion)
Turn off comment notification (Settings -> Discussion)
Turn off "anyone can register" (Settings -> General)
Uncheck "discourage search engines from indexing your site" (Settings -> Reading)
Confirm default post category is not "Uncategorized" (Settings -> Writing)
WordPress Design
Choose and install your theme (confirm it supports your brand identity)
Customize your theme (child-theme if needed). Logo, tag line and related
Set up the menu structure [may depend on theme you are using]
Preview your theme in all major browsers
Preview your theme on phones and tablets
Create a test post (add images, lists, links, text, headings, block quotes) to insure format and style
Add your favicon
Add title , tag line , and description to your site, posts, pages
Update permalink structure (post name) (Settings -> Permalinks)
Add your site to Google Search Console
Add site to MS Clarity (https://clarity.microsoft.com/) to better understand site usage
Install Google Analytics (or Matamo)
Generate XML Sitemap (see plugins below)
Submit sitemap to Google Search Console
If you need help with spelling, consider Grammarly (https://www.grammarly.com/)

You may wish to consider a CDN (Content Distribution Network) for site components (perhaps relying on AWS or similar)
WordPress Plugins
Coming soon page (if needed) (SeedProd)
Contact form (WPForms)
SMTP to send email (WP Mail SMTP)
Secure your site (WordFence)
Track analytics (WP Statistics)
Backups (and test a restore to confirm they work) (UpDraftPlus)
SEO (Yoast)
Performance (WP Rocket)
Add honeypot for comment spam (WP Armour – Honeypot Anti Spam). Alternatives include Cleantalk (https://cleantalk.org/) [This one costs] or Gravity Forms Anti Spam (https://www.gravityforms.com/) [This also costs]
XML Sitemap Generator for Google
Pre-Launch Functionality
Proofread all content on your site (including phone numbers)
Confirm contact information is accurate
Test all forms on the site and confirm form can be submitted and you receive info
Confirm images display in proper size with all browsers and mobile devices
Confirm site passes current minimum WCAG (Web Content Accessibility Guidelines)
Verify any call to action (buttons, links) work properly

Configure 2FA for all site administrators (Google or Microsoft Authenticator)
Check all links for 404 errors
Launching your site [or moving your site]
Spread the word on appropriate social media (there are many, choose wisely)
Announce your site (perhaps guest posts – you know your industry, you decide)
Check Google Analytics periodically
Grow your site (add meaningful content)
Use a tool like Uptime Robot to confirm your site remains available
Consider how to deal with 301 redirects (from your previous site)
Set up 404 page not found process (Redirection is one such plugin)
If migrating, consider using a plugin like All-in-One WP Migration
Review site performance periodically using tools like Lighthouse (Chrome Developer tools).
